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1. INTRODUCTION

These Terms of Reference are to be read in conjunction with the Governance of College Bodies By-law. The Governance of College Bodies By-law and these Terms of Reference govern the College Body.

1.1. Established

The South Australian Trainees' Committee is established under the authority of the South Australian Committee to perform the Functions set out in these Terms of Reference and all matters ancillary to those functions.

1.2. Term

The term of the South Australian Trainees' Committee is for three years.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of South Australian Trainees' Committee is to advance the interest of local members in South Australia (SA) as policy and advocacy champions, facilitate and promote educational opportunities for trainees within this jurisdiction, and advocate on training matters within local hospitals and clinical settings.

3. FUNCTIONS

The functions of the South Australian Trainees' Committee are:

- a) Provide a forum which represents the views of trainees.
- b) Advocate on behalf of trainees in matters relating to their selection, training, assessment, supervision and overall education experience.
- c) Make recommendations to the SA Committee regarding policy relating to trainee matters.
- d) Advance the interest of the College in SA in the activities of the College.
- e) Support the training and careers of trainees in SA.
- f) The activities of the Committee must be consistent with the policies, projects and direction of the SA Committee that have College wide responsibility in respect of education, training, trainees, continual professional development and workforce and the College's strategic directions.

3.1. Committee Prohibitions

The Committee must not:

- Enter into any agreement binding upon it or the College; and
- Represent or imply in any way that the Committee is a body independent of the College.

4. MEMBER COMPOSITION

The Membership of the College Body shall comprise up to eleven members, who must reside in South Australia, comprising:

- One Advanced Trainee in an Adult specialty
- One Advanced Trainee in a Paediatric specialty
- One Basic Trainee in an Adult specialty
- One Basic Trainee in a Paediatric specialty
- One Trainee from any of the three RACP faculties: Australasian Faculty of Public Health Medicine (AFPHM), Australasian Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine (AFRM) or Australasian Faculty of Occupational and Environmental Medicine (AFOEM).

Members are selected by an expression of interest process in accordance with [Governance of College bodies By-laws](#).

Board members may attend meetings of the Trainees' Committee in the state/territory which they reside as observers.

The Committee will elect two co-chairs;

- One Trainee in an Adult specialty
- One Trainee in a Paediatric specialty

Chairs must already be members of the Committee to be eligible for appointment. The Committee will elect one or two members to represent the Trainees' Committee on the Committee. They will attend the SA Committee meetings.

5. MEETING

This section is to be read in conjunction with the [Governance of College Bodies By-law](#).

5.1. Number of Meetings

The College Body shall hold a minimum of four meetings per calendar year with the provision of one face to face meeting per year and the rest held via videoconference.

5.2. Chair

The Chair/s or their appointee will Chair all meetings.

5.3. Quorum

A quorum is one half of the total College Body membership.

5.4. Voting

Decisions will be made by consensus of the majority of members.

5.5. Secretariat

One of the Trainee Committee members will be the Secretariat as voted by the Committee. Meeting agenda, supporting papers and minutes or outcomes will be provided prior to the date of the meeting.

5.6. Committee Reviews

The Committee are to undertake a skill and experience review annually.

The Committee are to review their performance against this By-law every two years.

6. REPORTING

The Committee must report and make recommendations to the SA Committee as required.

The Committee is required to provide the following to the SA Committee each year:

- A new or updated Work Plan (Work Plans may be one or two years).
- A report against the preceding years' Work Plan.
- Meeting minutes once confirmed.
