By-law

BY-LAW PURSUANT TO THE CONSITUTION OF THE ROYAL AUSTRALASIAN COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF BOARD COMMITTEES

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Board of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians has established the Victorian Committee (the “Committee”). The Governance of College Bodies By-law sets out the general provisions for governance of Board Committees. Both the Governance of College Bodies By-law and this By-law govern the Committee.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Committee is to advance the interest of local members in Victoria (VIC) as policy and advocacy champions, facilitate and promote educational opportunities for Fellows and trainees within this jurisdiction and advocate on training matters within local hospitals and clinical settings.

3. FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Victorian Committee include:

- a) Advocate for and lead the development of Victorian based policy priorities.
- b) Facilitate effective connections with Victorian governments and advocate on behalf of the College, Fellows and trainees with health or other portfolio Ministers on locally based issues.
- c) Contribute to College wide policy through nomination and participation on the College Policy and Advocacy Committee (CPAC) to represent Victorian perspectives and to strategically shape the College’s policy and advocacy agenda – including bringing locally based policy challenges to the attention of CPAC.
- d) Advocate for and promote College-wide education priorities within Victorian with Fellows, trainees, health authorities and relevant stakeholders.
- e) Contribute to College wide strategic direction through nomination and participation on the College Council to represent Victorian perspectives and to strategically shape the College’s strategic agenda – including bringing the locally based policy challenges to the attention of the Council.
- f) Enable positive interactions and liaison points with health-related organisations and regulators to support initiatives that improve health outcomes for local communities and maintain standards of the profession for Victorian Fellows and trainees.
- g) Seek to represent the College in the media on local issues following receipt of approval via the College’s media evaluation process.
- h) Recommend College representatives for nomination on external Victorian bodies to the RACP President for approval
- i) Facilitate and promote educational opportunities and deliver locally organised educational forums for Fellows and trainees within Victoria.

- j) Provide insights to the College Education Committee and the Continuing Professional Development Committee on the needs of Victorian members.

4. COMMITTEE PROHIBITIONS

The Committee must not:

- Enter into any agreement binding upon it or on the College; or
- Represent or imply in any way that the Committee is a body independent of the College.

5. MEMBER COMPOSITION

The Membership of the Committee shall comprise up to eleven members, who must be residing in Victoria comprising of the following:

- Five elected members;
- Five appointed members; and
- A trainee representative appointed by the Victorian Tasmanian Trainees Committee, which may be the Chair/Co-Chairs or another representative/s (ex-officio)

Board members may attend meetings of the Committee in the state/territory in which they reside, as observers.

5.1. Ex-officio Members

- A trainee representative appointed by the Victorian Tasmanian Trainees' Committee which may be the Chair/co-Chairs or another representative.

5.2. Appointed Members

[Members appointed via an Expression of Interest process]

Up to five appointed members residing in Victoria, nominated by the respective Division, Faculty or Chapter Body they are representing comprising at least one:

- Member of the Adult Medicine Division
- Member of the Paediatrics and Child Health Division; and
- Member representing the faculties.

5.3. Elected Members

[Members appointed via the College election process]

Up to five elected members, residing in Victoria elected by College members residing in Victoria including at least one:

- Member of the Adult Medicine Division
- Member of the Paediatrics and Child Health Division; and

- Member representing the faculties.

5.4. Co-opted members

Co-opted members may be appointed for a particular purpose or term.

6. MEETING

This section is to be read in conjunction with the [Governance of College Bodies By-law](#).

6.1. Number of Meetings

The College Body shall hold a minimum of five meetings per calendar year and shall meet by teleconference, two face to face meetings or videoconference.

6.2. Chair

The Chair or their appointee will Chair all meetings.

6.3. Quorum

A quorum is one half of the total College Body membership.

6.4. Voting

Decisions will be made by consensus of the majority of members.

6.5. Minutes

The proceedings of all meetings of the Committee shall be recorded in the minutes.

6.6. Secretariat

Meeting agenda, supporting papers and minutes or outcomes will be provided prior to the date of the meeting.

6.7. Committee/Council Reviews

The Committee/Council are to undertake a skill and experience review annually.

The Committee/Council are to review their performance against this By-law every two years.

7. REPORTING

The Committee must report and make recommendations to the Board as required.

The Committee is required to provide to the Board each year:

- a new or updated Work Plan (Work Plans may be one or two years)
- a report against the preceding years' Work Plan.

8. REVIEW OF BY-LAW

This By-law will be reviewed every three years.
