

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Creating a platform for innovation through eHealth

From July 2012, your patients can choose to register for a personally controlled electronic health record.

The national eHealth record system will provide access to key health information drawn from local clinical information systems. With your patient's consent, this information can be quickly and securely shared with all healthcare professionals involved in their care.

July 2012 is just the starting point for the eHealth record system. The more healthcare professionals and organisations that participate, the better connected the network will become, and the better it will serve you and your patients.

Only identified healthcare professionals, including medical specialists, can enter information in the clinical record. Patients will have a separate section in which to enter demographic and basic health information, and to keep their own notes.

You and your healthcare organisation can start preparing now for the new eHealth record system.


Venue Floor Plans

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
Merivale Street Foyer Level






MERIVALE STREET

ATM Facilities

There are two ATMs situated on the main exhibition concourse of the Brisbane Convention & Exhibition Centre. Other ATMs are available nearby in the South Bank precinct.

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Opening Plenary

'Our Challenge to Repair and Restore Tissues: No Fate But What We Make'

Professor John E. J. Rasko

BSc (Med), MBBS (Hons), PhD, MAICD, FFSc(RCPA), FRCPA, FRACP

Professor John Rasko is a physician, pathologist and scientist with a productive track record in gene and stem cell therapy, experimental haematology and molecular biology. In over 130 papers he has contributed to the understanding of stem cells and blood cells, gene transfer technologies, and human diseases.

Professor John Rasko is chair of GTTAC, Office of the Gene Technology Regulator – responsible for regulating all genetically-modified organisms in Australia. Contributions to scientific organisations include cofounding and past-President of the Australasian Gene Therapy Society; Vice President, International Society for Cellular Therapy; Scientific Advisory Committees and Board member for philanthropic foundations; and several Ethics Committees. He is the recipient of national and international awards in recognition of his commitment to excellence in medical research, including the 2011 Susman Award from the RACP for the most outstanding contribution to the knowledge of any branch of internal medicine by a Fellow.

Professor Sir Michael Marmot has led a research group on health inequalities for 35 years. He is Principal Investigator of the Whitehall II Studies of British Civil Servants, investigating explanations for the striking inverse social gradient in morbidity and mortality. He leads the English Longitudinal Study of Ageing (ELSA) and is engaged in several international research efforts on the social determinants of health. He was a member of the Royal Commission on Environmental Pollution for six years, and served as President of the British Medical Association (BMA) in 2010 - 2011. He is a Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences, an Honorary Fellow of the British Academy, and an Honorary Fellow of the Faculty of Public Health of the Royal College of Physicians. In 2000 he was knighted by Her Majesty The Queen, 'for services to Epidemiology and the understanding of health inequalities'. Internationally acclaimed, Professor Marmot is a Foreign Associate Member of the Institute of Medicine (IOM), and a former Vice President of the Academia Europaea. He won the Balzan Prize for Epidemiology in 2004, gave the Harveian Oration in 2006, and won the William B. Graham Prize for Health Services Research in 2008. He was Chair of the Commission on Social Determinants of Health (CSDH), which was set up by the World Health Organization in 2005, and produced the report entitled: 'Closing the Gap in a Generation'. At the request of the British Government, he conducted a review of health inequalities, which published its report 'Fair Society, Healthy Lives' in February 2010.

'Cancer Immunotherapy in the 21st Century'

Professor lan Frazer

CEO and Director of Research

Professor Ian Frazer is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Translational Research Institute (TRI) in Brisbane, Australia. In his role as CEO, Professor Frazer is charged with leading the \$354 million TRI to achieve its mission of being Australia's first institute, and one of only a few in the world, to research, trial and manufacture breakthrough drugs in the one location, once construction is complete in 2012. The TRI will accommodate up to 650 researchers from the four TRI partners: The University of Queensland, Queensland University of Technology, Mater Medical Research Institute and the Princess Alexandra Hospital.

Internationally-renown for the co-creation of the technology for the cervical cancer vaccines, Professor Frazer began his career as a renal physician and clinical immunologist in Edinburgh, Scotland before emigrating in 1981 to Melbourne, Australia. He continued his clinical training and pursued studies in viral immunology and autoimmunity at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research with Professor lan Mackay. In 1985, Professor Frazer accepted a teaching post with The University of Queensland and was appointed Director of The University of Queensland Diamantina Institute in 1991. In early 2011, Professor Frazer relinquished directorship of the Institute to commence in-post as CEO of the TRI. He retains an active research program at the Institute in immune responses to cancer.

Professor Frazer was awarded the 2005 CSIRO Eureka Prize for Leadership in Science and was selected as Queenslander of the Year, and Australian of the Year in 2006. He was also awarded the 2008 Prime Minister's Prize for Science, the 2008 Balzan Prize for Preventative Medicine, the 2009 Honda Prize and was recently elected as a Fellow of the esteemed Royal Society of London. Honorary Fellowship of the Australasian Chapter of Sexual Health Medicine was conferred on Professor Frazer at the College Ceremony on Sunday, 6 May 2012.

Graham Vimpani is Professor of Community Child and Family Health at the University of Newcastle; Clinical Chair of Kaleidoscope: Hunter Children's Health Network within the Hunter New England Local Health District and senior Paediatrician in the Child Protection Team at the John Hunter Children's Hospital in Newcastle. He is also a part-time Senior Clinical Advisor in Child Protection for the NSW Ministry of Health.

He has a longstanding interest in promoting child development through evidence-based collaborative early intervention strategies that address the support needs of families with young children. He is a member of the research team that trialled sustained nurse home visiting in the Miller Early Childhood Sustained Home Visiting (MECSH) in Western Sydney prior to its expansion as part of the NSW Government's Keep them Safe strategy following the Wood Commission of Inquiry into child protection. Other major research interests have included investigating the impact of lead exposure on child development and the epidemiology of childhood injuries.

He has also served on the Boards of several non-government organisations providing services to children, including the advocacy body NIFTeY Australia (National Investment for the Early Years) of which he was chair from 1999-2012. He is also Chair of the Monitoring and Reporting group established to oversight the implementation of the NT Government's response to the 2010 Board of Inquiry review of child protection.

Professor Vimpani was a recipient of the Centenary Medal in 2003 for services to early childhood. He was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in 2007 for service to medicine as a paediatrician committed to improving child health and welfare through contributions to a range of government, professional and community organizations, and as an academic, researcher and clinician.

Dr Kenneth Nunn is a senior child psychiatrist and paediatric neuropsychiatrist. He currently works in the neurodevelopmental team at the Children's Hospital Westmead. He is the clinical partner in a two person Molecular Neuropsychiatry Service with Dr Ruth Urwin, Principal Hospital Scientist, responsible for identifying and interpreting CYP genotype polymorphisms relevant to psychotropic medication.

Dr Kenneth Nunn, with colleagues from the United Kingdom, recently proposed a causal model for anorexia nervosa in an attempt to develop scientifically testable hypotheses of mental illness. He is currently working on a similar approach with disorders of aggression and mood in anticipation of the international move to brain-based diagnosis of mental illness to replace the current DSM approach.

Professor Dame Carol Black is a past-President of the Royal College of Physicians and immediate past-President of the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges. The Centre she established at the Royal Free Hospital in London is internationally renowned for research and treatment of connective tissue diseases. Since the early 1990s she has worked at board level in a number of organisations, including the Royal Free Hospital Hampstead NHS Trust, the Health Foundation, the NHS Institute for Innovation and Improvement, and the Imperial College Healthcare Charity, and she has chaired the UK Health Honours Committee.

Professor Dame Carol Black is a Trustee of the National Portrait Gallery, a member of the committee for the Queen's Awards for Voluntary Service, and on several national committees aiming to improve healthcare. She is a foreign affiliate of the US Institute of Medicine and has been awarded many honorary degrees and fellowships.






